A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, people of all ages throughout the world have developed illnesses from Toxic Injury, also referred to as Chemically Induced Illness; and

WHEREAS, Toxic Injury is often characterized by heightened sensitivity to very small amounts of air pollution, petrochemicals and other toxins found in our everyday products and environment; and

WHEREAS, Toxic Injury may include multiple, often disabling, illnesses affecting the respiratory, central nervous, immune, musculoskeletal, metabolism, and endocrine systems, and can be life-threatening; and

WHEREAS, Toxic Injury is a chronic, debilitating condition for which there is no known cure, causing serious financial, employment, learning, housing, health, social and other consequences; and

WHEREAS, those suffering with Toxic Injury disease deserve the same rights, acknowledgement, respect, support and help allotted to people with other illnesses and disabilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jim Doyle, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim May, 2008

TOXIC INJURY AWARENESS AND EDUCATION MONTH

in the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance to all citizens.
